

WELCOME TO THE TOWN OF HOLLISTON!

Holliston is home to several hundred thriving entrepreneurial companies and we are grateful to the small, often family-owned businesses who provide highly valuable services, employ Holliston residents and contribute greatly to our quality of life and the economic strength of our town. The Board of Selectmen, Town Administrator and Town staff are all committed to supporting the town's business community and ensuring its continued growth and vitality.

Holliston is a lively Metrowest community, strategically located between Boston, Worcester and Providence with a small-town vibe. Over twenty percent of the community is comprised of

permanently protected open space, including portions of the Charles River Watershed Natural Valley Storage Area. As a right-to-farm community, there are several commercial farms, an increasing number of small farms and even a community farm. Holliston covers 19 square miles and is bordered by the Towns of Ashland, Hopkinton, Milford, Medway, Millis, and Sherborn. As part of Middlesex County, Holliston was incorporated in 1724.

Holliston has a Town Meeting form of government, where residents gather twice annually and vote on financial and other matters. Residents elect a three-member Board of Selectmen and the Town Administrator handles the day-to-day town operations.

LOCATION

Holliston, MA is located 21.6 miles west of Boston in the area better known as MetroWest with the Charles River passing near the Town's southern region. The Town is within a short driving distance of Interstate 495 and the Massachusetts Turnpike. Residents who wish to take public transportation can do so at one of the nearby commuter rail stations located in Ashland, Natick, Framingham or Franklin.

First settled in 1659 by Europeans from the Massachusetts Bay Puritans Colony, it wasn't until 1724 that it was incorporated as a Town in honor of Thomas Hollis, a benefactor of Harvard College. Holliston was and still is the quintessential New England town. With no great moment in history to mark its founding or landscape, it is a town which reflects and celebrates the accomplishments and character of its residents, often defining itself as a "home of heroes of the commonplace". Known today as a bedroom community for Boston, Route 128 and Route 495 technology belts, residents of Holliston take pride in their community and it shows with a downtown looking like it was plucked straight from a Norman Rockwell painting.



WHY DO Business IN HOLLISTON

Holliston is a great place to do business in. Businesses are part of the community and receive support from the municipality as well as the residents. Business owners often live in Town, making them vested stakeholders in the community. With a wide range of businesses to choose from, ranging from agricultural to industrial and all of the recreation and service businesses in between plus with designated industrial parks, Holliston uses its commercial culture to enhance its economic vitality.

Holliston Business Association

The purpose of the Holliston Business Association (HBA) is to serve and support all local Holliston businesses and to give back to the community. The HBA was originally founded in the 1950s by local Holliston businesses who were interested in working cohesively together to improve the business environment within the Town.

Officially chartered as a non-profit in 1978, this strong networking group also provides scholarship grants to high school seniors pursuing degrees in business through its scholarship trust.

WHY Pive IN HOLLISTON

Once populated by factories and farms up until the late nineteenth century, Holliston has now transformed itself into a bedroom community for Boston and the Route 128 and Route 495 technology belts. Holliston is known for its quaint Town Center home to Fiske's General Store, the Holliston Superette, and Holliston Grill, plus numerous antique shops and boutiques, the Carnegie public library, the Holliston Town Hall, and white-steepled churches. Numerous white antique colonial, Greek revival, and Victorian homes with well-manicured lawns surround the town green. The scene is distinctively New England.

NEIGHBORHOODS

East Holliston Historic District & Mudville

These National and State Historic Districts encompass an area of early development along Washington Street (Rte. 16), extending nearly continuously eastbound from Highland Street to Old Locust Street. Comprised of many styles of residential construction - Federal, Colonial, Gothic and Greek Revival, Second Empire, and

Italiante - these structures represent the best of Holliston's heritage. Located off Washington Street in the heart of the downtown is Mudville, comprised of several hundred modest historic homes, reflecting the Town's industrial heritage of shoe and straw hat factories and shops along the Boston and Worcester railroad line and Winthrop Canal. Mudville claims bragging rights to the famous Amercian poem "Casey at the Bat: A Ballad of the

Republic Sung in the Year 1888" written in by Ernest Thayer.

Brentwood, The Queens, Strawberry
Hill, Bald Hill, and East Holliston are the
more well- known sections of Town. Newer
neighborhoods and developments include
Carriage House Estates, Constitution
Village, Balancing Rock Hills Preserve,
Brooksmont and Holliston Woods.

Holliston was awarded America in Blooms 'Best in its Population Size' again in 2016 and received the highest designation of "5 Blooms" for Outstanding Community Involvement!



Holliston in Bloom

Established in 2012, Holliston in Bloom is a part of the national America in Bloom program. It is an all-volunteer, non-profit organization that promotes town-wide beautification, historic preservation and community development by encouraging the use of flowers, plants and trees in their

projects. The organization works collaboratively with residents, businesses and the municipal departments to make the Town a more beautiful and vibrant place. Holliston hosted the 2017 America in Bloom National Symposium with a theme of "History. Horticulture. Holliston." which attracted a national audience to the beautiful Town.

Upper Charles Trail

The Upper Charles Trail is a proposed 25-mile hiking/biking/walking trail that will connect the communities of Milford, Hop-kinton, Ashland, Sherborn and Holliston. The trail will use the abandoned CSX rail bed as the basis for the route, with Milford already having completed its 6.58-mile section. The Trail in Holliston is proposed to be 6.7-miles and is supported by the Rail Trail Committee and community volunteers. The Legend of Balancing Rock

Weighing in at over 5 tons sits a rock 20 feet long, 10 feet wide and six feet thick precariously seeming to be balanced on a piece of granite ledge. The legend goes that in 1789, General George Washington marched, with his troops, from Boston to New York through Holliston and came across the Balancing Rock. The men, and Mr. Washington himself, took the opportunity to have a bit of fun and tried, to no avail, to tip over the rock. The Rock still stands today and is the property of the Balancing Rock development, a community for active adults over the age of 55.

Delicious Dining
