Public Hearing

Frank Chamberlain invited members to comment on areas under the purview of the committees they represent. There was a discussion of where the Committee could go in the future, based on the comments of each representative. Frank Chamberlain reviewed the way the funds are allocated. Open Space, Housing and Historic Preservation are each allocated ten percent of the CPA funds. Generally, funding for Recreation projects has been taken out of the remaining 70% of funds.

There were no comments from the public.

Discussion/Vote on CPA Proposals

Stoddard Park Tennis Courts

Ms. Kaspern reported on the proposal. \$168,500 is the total. Parks and Recreation will contribute \$20,000. The goal is to have work completed by next spring. This will create a new opportunity for active recreation in Holliston. The courts will be used for summer camp and open to the public.

VOTE Moved: To allocate the to sum of 168,500 to construct the tennis courts and amenities at Stoddard. This will sunset in two years

CPA Plan

The discussion during Public Comment covered much of this topic, but there is still the question of whether the Committee would like to have a needs assessment or survey to open up the topic to a wider Town discussion. Do people know what the CPA is, and who can use it: that is something to investigate. Frank Chamberlain noted that the CPA grant to the Town Clerk allowed preservation of historic documents in her office, and the restored books are back. There could be a reception to invite the public to enjoy the results. Warren Chamberlain noted that the Planning Board would be hosting half-hour discussions of different areas in Town at the start of their meetings.

New Business

Frank Chamberlain will meet with the Finance Committee next Tuesday night, March 8, 2016. There will be one more meeting before Town Meeting.

The next CPC meeting was scheduled for April 13th 2016.
