Acquisition Donated from Avery Donahoe Corporation in 1992

and Mission Springs Paved to be divided in 1997

Vegetation: Mixed forest, predominantly Pine and Oak species

Wetlands are mostly Red Maple and abandoned cranberry bog

Wildlife Habitat: Deer, fox, squirrel, birds, nifted grouse, wood frog

Three centuries of ponds and prime old habitat

Cedars, shallow depth to bedrock, and various rock outcrops

Historic Interest: Foot Lane is located on the site and was the Indian trail from South Natick to Mendon.

It can be valued as a transition the property from east to west. Old cedar holes date from the

initial period of settlement in Holliston, circa 1700

Topography: Rolling with rise towards wetlands and outcrops of bedrock

Parting available off of Summer Street adjacent to the Wildlife Building.

Pedestrian Access: Off of Holliston Street between the intersections with Rolling Meadow Drive and

off of the railroad bed east of the Chicken Brook.
