## **Beals & Thomas Masterplan**

Dave LaPointe from Beals & Thomas brought everyone up to speed on where the Master Plan originated. The idea to do this project came from hearing requests from the community, then merging those ideas with the ideas of the former Parks & Recreation Director.

There was a lot of discussion surrounding the need for a survey to the community by all attendees to determine how we should prioritize projects.

Mark Frank informed the group that Jeff Ritter, Town Administrator and Sean Reese, DPW Director, will attend our next meeting scheduled for August 29. Mr. Ritter and Mr. Reese will discuss the possible new position of a Facilities Manager and seek our assistance in clarifying the job description. They wish to bring this position to town meeting due. This position is being created due to the number of change orders and rework performed on many of the recent building projects in town.

Mr. Frank also reported that a few incidents were reported Stoddard Park this summer (on Facebook). In response to this, he has asked Chief Stone for a stronger police presence at the park especially during non-staffed hours. Lieutenant Denman approached Mr. Frank at a recent event and stated that the officers will not only patrol the parking lot, but will walk around the park/lakefront.

Finally, Mr. Frank reported that he has had inquiries from community members about why Stoddard Park is open to non-residents of Holliston. He will research information about the grant received a number of years ago and report back.
