Without seeing the rest of the survey, it is hard to rank how important these items are for me, so I just put not important to most of them, but that doesn't adequately capture how I feel. I had trouble answering because I think the phrasing of many of these questions is problematic, as many of them discuss preserving and protecting, and this may be at odds with much needed CHANGE in Holliston. They all sound desirable at face value, but what would "promote development placement (zoning) that protects water resources and open spaces" mean, for example? How might that undermine efforts to expand affordable housing in Holliston? How might it deter the building of the high school, if we decide that we need to build on what has been deemed open space that people want to preserve?

I answered #1 because I want to express that making sure that we have quality water in our community is important and we need to make sure we are fixing whatever we need to fix so that no Holliston resident has brown water, as so many have experienced.

I support "quality" beaches and trails, but to me this means accessible to all. I am frustrated that the grills were removed from Stoddard Park as I think they were an attractive feature to many people who don't have backyards or access to swimming pools. The grills drew in diversity. Some Holliston residents commented that the people who were using them "weren't from here", which is racially coded language. The grills are no longer available and the beaches in our town, one place where we saw racially diverse crowds, are less diverse. I fear that "quality" will mean different things to different people.

Some idea I have around environmental goals would be making Holliston a place where "green" businesses want to set up shop. I'm not sure if Holliston has a community farm, but a farm co-op where people could grow together and then each receive a share of the produce would be great. Holliston is a right to farm community, which is great. I would like to see it made illegal to have HOA bylaws in town which ban having any sort of farm animals.

Yes, of course I want our kids and teachers safe. I do not believe this is achieved through having school resource officers. Historically and currently, police are not always considered safe for black and brown people. The presence of police officers at schools likely has the opposite effect for students of color – they do not feel reassured by this presence. National data show that black and brown students are more likely to be harmed and arrested by school resource officers than their white peers.

I am interested in safety from bullying, sexual violence and harassment, of which female and queer students are particularly targeted. I want mandatory comprehensive sex education from the elementary level and all the way up to high school. I want a school culture that cracks down on sexism, homophobia, transphobia and misogyny.

I am interested in safety from racial, cultural and anti-Semitic bullying. I want a curriculum overhaul that integrates truth telling about our nation's roots in white supremacy, slavery, and genocide, as well as homophobia and sexism. I want administration, faculty, and students to examine their own internalized bias, whether racist, anti-Semitic or otherwise. I want teachers to connect this truth to how students can notice how systemic inequality today persists and how to recognize it. This will all make the school a safer place for the non-Christian kids, the girls, non-white kids, the queer kids. And they will be better humans and citizens.

I want a no tolerance policy for any sort of bullying or harassment, whether it is deemed as targeting a 'marginalized' group or not. This means offenders must be held accountable using a restorative justice model. They must learn how the behavior harmed another person, why, and learn about respectful and accepting ways to interact with peers.

Why are there financial constraints? Why can't we prioritize our list and work to fund it? I am a taxpayer and want to see our town improve over the next 20 years. Why are we assuming financial constraints? Are we assuming that our community will not fund initiatives? We have booming real estate in Holliston because of our schools. This is the time to envision our future, plan for the town we want and work toward funding it. As a former taxpayer in other surrounding towns, I voted in overrides for the schools in the past. It did increase my taxes. I am not financially in the top half of income earners in Holliston but I do support increases in taxes when I see the path laid out before me. Medway did this years ago and it passed. Now look where they are, they climbed out of a very difficult financial situation, they have full time police, fire/EMS, and a beautiful high school. 
