

Fire/EMS updates

Implementing the study of Fire and EMS services by Municipal Resources, Inc (MRI)

- Moving toward an Advanced Life Support (ALS) Certification
- Addition of an Assistant Fire Chief to help the organization
- Recommendations for changes to procedures
- Ongoing process that will take time to complete
- Much appreciation to the first responders for their dedication every day and their feedback throughout the transition

Dispatch Update

Moving to a Regional Dispatch Model (RECC) for Fire/EMS and Police

Select Board approved the move as of 1/1/24

Sherborn has already moved and has shown positive results

State supported move with grants

Saves the town from large-scale capital investment



Police Updates


With dispatch moving off-site, operational changes are needed

Board/Committee Collaboration


Working Group established in 2022 to iron out differences on capital

- Finance Committee and Select Board Members initially
- Led to an October 2022 proposal to fund ADA compliance issues with sidewalks over time
- Added School Committee members

Compromises led to a financial model for funding bigger projects

- Two main projects: DPW Facility and sidewalk improvements
- Utilizing Capital reserves, borrowing within the omnibus budget (non-excluded debt) and outside of the tax levy (excluded debt)
- Two articles are being presented to you this evening

Intention is to leave enough room for high school project



DPW Facility (Article 21)

Currently using 2 facilities on Central Street and Arch Street

Both are well beyond their useful life

Select Board has chosen 20 Cross Street "Axton Cross" as potential site for new facility (pending taken from land court)

Funding between cash and borrowing

Upcoming Ballot question on 5/23

FUNDING BREAKDOWN

\$7.00 million cash (CapEx)

\$17.25 million borrowing (non-excluded)*

\$5.75 million borrowing (excluded)**

\$30.00 million total project cost estimate, including soft costs

*Balances within normal Operating Budget

**Requires ballot question, in addition to Warrant Article

Water projects drive the progress

Mix of using cash and borrowing

Borrowing allows these projects to accelerate from 10+ years to 5+ years

Minimize the impact to taxpayers and maximize the benefits to residents

These projects will be completed over time as the water enterprise fund is replenished

Town Meeting will need to improve each of these appropriations in the coming years




Article 29: Tree Ordinance

Garden Club has been instrumental in bringing the idea of making Holliston a "Tree City USA"

This is a step in the process: to create by-laws to support protecting trees

The ordinance is meant for trees on public land UNLESS the activity requires a Stormwater or Land Disturbance permit

The Planning Board, the Tree Warden, and the Select Board all have roles to play in protecting trees in town



Article 25: Goodwill Park

Project is being championed by Parks & Recreation and supported (funded) by the CPC

Part of the "downtown corridor" down Central Street






Downtown Corridor Continued

<u>Streetlights</u>: converting all to LED. Technology Director Chris Meo helped get the Green Communities Grant and return funds to the town


<u>Pinecrest Golf Course</u>: updates to clubhouse, proshop, and restaurant

The town will aggressively pursue any and all grant opportunities to offset the impact on Holliston Residents!




