

Weekly COVID-19 Report

When the DPH published the updated town by town information this evening, our community risk designation remained at the GREY level, based on new cases in the 14 day period ending June 12. According to their weekly reports, our numbers lowered from 2.6 Average Daily Incident Rate per 100,000 on June 10 down to 0 Average Daily Incident Rate per 100,000 on June 17. Our percent positivity lowered from 0.85% the previous week down to 0% this week.




Looking at our 1 active case, it is located at one address; a single family home.

According to vaccination data by community released by the state, 80.4% of the population is partially vaccinated, and 71.9% of the population is fully vaccinated as of June 15. As of the report 101% of the 65-74 age group, and 103% of the 75+ age group had received at least 1 shot. As of this report, data also showed 87% of the 12-15 year olds and 110% of the 16-19 year olds having already received at least one shot.




According to an analysis of MAVEN data, there were no new cases this past week.







On Monday, June 14, the Emergency Management Director provided the following *CARES Act* spending breakdown to the Select Board. The chart represents municipal spending, and does not reflect expenses charged to the ESSER or *CARES Act* funds received by the schools. The Planning and Development Expenses do reflect technology purchased by the schools, for which the Select Board had committed municipal *CARES* funding prior to the July 2020 Annual Town Meeting. The amounts indicated are prior to any potential reimbursement for eligible expenses.



On Monday, June 14, the Select Board voted to rescind the local State of Emergency which had been enacted on March 16, 2020. This action was taken on the eve of the Gubernatorial State of Emergency for the Commonwealth of Massachusetts expiring at midnight on June 15.

On Monday, June 14, the Select Board authorized the Emergency Management Director to apply to the Massachusetts' Executive Office for Administration and Finance (A&F) for the Town's first allocation of federal *American Rescue Plan Act* (ARPA) funding.
