

Weekly COVID-19 Report

When the DPH published the updated town by town information this evening, our community risk designation remained in the YELLOW level, based on new cases in the 14 day period ending August 21. According to their weekly reports, our numbers raised from 18.7 Average Daily Incident Rate per 100,000 on August 19 to 19.3 Average Daily Incident Rate per 100,000 on August 26. Our percent positivity lowered from 3.48% last week to 3.1% this week.




We currently have eighteen cases at single family homes, one cluster at a single family home, 1 single case at a multi-family dwelling, and one active case at a long-term care facility.

According to vaccination data by community released by the state, 84% of the population is partially vaccinated, and 78% of the population is fully vaccinated as of August 24. As of the report 103% of the 65-74 age group, and 104% of the 75+ age group had received at least 1 shot. As of this report, data also showed 103% of the 12-15 year olds and 119% of the 16-19 year olds having already received at least one shot.





In the last week, the number of cases increased the most in the 50-59, 80-89 (4%), 40-49 (3%), and 10-19, 30-39, and 60-69 (2%) age ranges.





On Wednesday, August 25, the Emergency Management Director provided the following *CARES Act* spending breakdown to the Select Board. The chart represents municipal spending, and does not reflect expenses charged to the ESSER or *CARES Act* funds received by the schools. The Planning and Development Expenses do reflect technology purchased by the schools, for which the Select Board had committed municipal *CARES* funding prior to the July 2020 Annual Town Meeting. The amounts indicated are prior to any potential reimbursement for eligible expenses.
