

## **Weekly COVID-19 Report**

When the DPH published the updated town by town information this evening, our community risk designation remained at the YELLOW level, based on new cases in the 14 day period ending October 16. According to their weekly reports, our numbers raised from 13 Average Daily Incident Rate per 100,000 on October 14 to 17.2 Average Daily Incident Rate per 100,000 on October 21. Our percent positivity raised from 1.7% last week to 2.16% this week.

Gray: less than or equal to 10 total cases



\*last 14 days refers to the two-week reporting period ending the Saturday prior to the DPH's weekly report


We currently have seven individual cases in single family homes, one cluster in a single family home, and an individual case at a multi-family dwelling.

According to vaccination data by community released by the state, 87% of the population is partially vaccinated, and 81% of the population is fully vaccinated as of October 19. As of the report 106% of the 65-74 age group, and 108% of the 75+ age group had received at least 1 shot. As of this report, data also showed 111% of the 12-15 year olds and 121% of the 16-19 year olds having already received at least one shot.





In the last week, the number of cases increased the most in the 0-9 (5%), 30-39 (3%), and 10-19 and 20-29 (2%) ages.





On Monday, October 18, the Emergency Management Director provided the following *CARES Act* spending breakdown to the Select Board. The chart represents municipal spending, and does not reflect expenses charged to the ESSER or *CARES Act* funds received by the schools. The Planning and Development Expenses do reflect technology purchased by the schools, for which the Select Board had committed municipal *CARES* funding prior to the July 2020 Annual Town Meeting. The amounts indicated are prior to any potential reimbursement for eligible expenses.
