

Weekly COVID-19 Report

When the DPH published the updated town by town information this evening, our community risk designation remained at the YELLOW (moderate risk) level, based on new cases in the 14 day period ending February 13. According to their weekly reports, our numbers lowered from 19.8 Average Daily Incident Rate per 100,000 on February 11 down to 15.6 Average Daily Incident Rate per 100,000 on February 18. Our percent positivity for the period ending February 13 lowered down to 2.27% from 2.70% the previous week. Our percent positivity is now down in the range that it was in late October.





Looking at our 23 active cases, they are spread over 19 addresses. There are clusters at 2 single family homes, 1 individual case at multi-family dwellings, 1 single case at a group home, and individual cases at 14 single family homes.



According to an analysis of MAVEN data, the largest increases in cases in the past week were in the 70-79 (5%), and 20-29, 50-59, and 60-69 (2%) age ranges. The 0-9, 10-19, 30-39, 80-89 and 90+ age ranges saw no new cases this past week.







On Tuesday, February 16, the Emergency Management Director provided the following *CARES Act* spending breakdown to the Select Board. The chart represents municipal spending, and does not reflect expenses charged to the ESSER or *CARES Act* funds received by the schools. The Planning and Development Expenses do reflect technology purchased by the schools, for which the Select Board had committed municipal *CARES* funding prior to the July 2020 Annual Town Meeting. The amounts indicated are prior to any potential reimbursement for eligible expenses.
