

Holliston Sustainability Initiatives Make An Impact

Holliston's Sustainability office focuses on increasing clean energy, reducing waste and adapting to climate change impacts. The department collaborates with other municipalities, the Commonwealth and other stakeholders to implement sustainable, cost-efficient practices that reduce our carbon footprint. Holliston has seen an uptick in participation this year.

The Town's Facebook page, and the Town website, are great ways to follow tips and programs. Two programs, the Town's Electric Aggregation and the Commonwealth's Mass Save, are worth considering as ways to save money and reduce your carbon footprint. The Community Choice Power Supply Program explains how your electric bill is broken up into two parts - you have to pay Eversource for delivery, but you can choose your supplier. This state website lists suppliers providing service in Town along with rates. If your electric bill lists "Nextera Engysv MA-Town of Holliston" as your supplier, you are already part of the Town's Aggregation program. If you would like to opt-in, CLICK HERE. Holliston Wins \$625k Drug Free Community Grant

The Holliston Drug and Alcohol Awareness Coalition (HDAAC), which is overseen by Youth & Family Services, won this very competitive grant - only one of six in Massachusetts, and one in 50 in the US. The grant provides funds to strengthen relationships with local community partners and implement programs to reduce youth substance use rates. It will be distributed over the next 5 years. 
JOIN OUR BIKE & LISTENING TOUR OF NORFOLK STREET!

Fire Prevention Week: October 9th - 15th



This year's theme is "Fire Won't Wait, Plan Your Escape". The focus of this campaign is to reinforce the critical importance of developing a home escape plan with all members of the household and practicing it regularly. In

addition, this October represents the 100th anniversary of Fire Prevention Week, the nation's longest running public health observance on record. According to the National Fire Prevention Association:

- Make sure your home escape plan meets the needs of all family members, including those with disabilities.
- Smoke alarms should be installed in every sleeping room, outside each separate sleeping area and on every level of your home. They should be interconnected, so when one alarms, they all alarm.
- Know at least two ways out of every room. Make sure doors and windows open easily.
- Have an outside meeting place and practice every year.
