Holliston's Future Is Bright

Ballot questions passed to address infrastructure, the need for a new DPW building and other priorities for the Town. As the needed Water Main Replacement projects begin on Norfolk, Central and Goulding Streets, voters authorized the installation of sidewalks to close gaps in the sidewalk network and improve pedestrian accessibility and safety.

Voters also supported a portion of the DPW Facility project to be financed with Excluded Debt (25%), per a financial model developed by a working group of Board/Committee members. The DPW Facility is proposed at 20 Cross St., known as "Axton-Cross", which is set to come out of Land Court soon. Holliston's 5-10 Year Strategic Plan Timeline Share Your Vision For Future Holliston By 6/12

Have you shared *your vision for the future* of Holliston? Deadline is June 12, 2023. (see link below). Berry Dunn, the consultant, presented the preliminary environmental scan at forums in May and will



update with community feedback. For meeting information about <u>Envisioning Future Holliston Committee (EFH) click here.</u> EFH Members have been working with Berry Dunn to connect with many groups and disciplines, including sustainability, diversity, economic development, the senior community and our students. Community Forums were hybrid and held in May at Town Hall, Senior Center and the High School, and all were well attended. Grant Win: Regional Trail Placemaking Uses Public Art



Metropolitan Area Planning Council (MAPC) awarded Holliston a \$10k grant to install a public art piece to inspire visitor traffic off the rail trail. This special grant program invests in Regional Rail Trail Placemaking for economic development and growth. Towns are leveraging their Rail


Trail by attracting recreational visitors to stop and spend dollars off the path. Studies show that public art, when strategically placed, can guide visitors off the rail trail toward businesses. Public art brings a community together and welcomes newcomers and visitors. MAPC will lead the grant project this summer with a committee, and hold a workshop to learn how to initiate future public art projects. An artist and location will be selected, and the art installation is planned for November.
