#### The MAPC & EDC Partnership (from pg. 1)

The Economic Development Committee (EDC) and the Metropolitan Area Planning Council (MAPC) hosted a community workshop to develop an Economic Development Vision and Service Model Plan. The presentation included project target areas, demographic and economic indicators, and qualitative data on community priorities. It also included vibrant small group discussions focused on potential economic development action areas. #### Long-Range Strategic Planning

The Town also voted to issue a Request For Proposals (RFP) for a consultant to consolidate the Town's many strategic plans (Schools, Police, Library, Parks & Rec. etc.) and the <u>data from the</u>



Town-wide survey of 1,100+ respondents and over 3,500 open responses to survey questions. The goal is to develop a 5-year strategic plan and vision for the future.

The Envisioning Future Holliston

Committee (EFH) was reorganized per

Town Meeting, and several new members

and alternates were appointed to continue the strong representation of the Town's diverse population and interests. The EFH Committee reviewed the RFP, and will interact with the Strategic Plan consultant once selected.

The Town also plans to leverage state, federal and grant funding opportunities for projects:

- Organizational Evaluation of Fire & EMT, and Dispatch Service Models
- Feasibility/Site Review for DPW Facility
- Cost Benefit Analysis of Reconstruction or Removal of Town-Owned Dams
- Horizontal Infrastructure Projects Water, Roadways & Sidewalks
- Envisioning Future Holliston

#### **Assessors' Office Accepting Abatement Applications**

Holliston property owners are reminded that they can submit a property tax abatement application to the Assessor's office if you think your property valuation is not correct. Applications will be accepted at the Town Hall Assessors' office between Jan 2, 2023 - Feb 1, 2023 by 4:30pm in order to be considered. If mailed, it must be US Mail post marked before Feb 1 to be considered. Abatement applications are available in the online forms section of the <u>Assessors' page HERE</u>, or download the form by <u>Clicking Here</u>. Members of the office are available to help you with every step in the process, feel free to call 508-429-0604.

Applicants must give their opinion of property value on the form. Within 30 days of receiving an application, assessors will request that a taxpayer who has filed an abatement application allow them to inspect the property. Also within 30 days, assessors may request to provide written information reasonably required to determine the property's fair cash value. Under state law, any taxpayer who fails to comply with assessor requests loses the right to appeal the assessors' action or inaction on the application, unless the noncompliance was for reasons beyond the taxpayer's control or the taxpayer attempted to comply in good faith. The Board will have 3 months to review and rule.

# ENGINE (1) MOLLISTON



Alarms! If you didn't, be sure you do. The manufacturing date is on the back. Replace smoke alarms after 10 years and carbon monoxide alarms after 5-7 years. Put fresh alkaline batteries in alarms if used.

In the coming months, remember hot ashes are extremely dangerous. Special steps need to be taken after the fire has burned out to protect your family and the community. Remember to safely dispose of hot ashes from your fireplace or wood stove.

#### **Holliston Fire Department Updates**

Holliston Fire continues to build its staff of On-Call Firefighters, EMT's, and Civilian Dispatchers as municipalities continue to see retirements across the country in all positions of public service.
