Open Town Meeting is a form of government where all residents have a 'say' and can vote on many

different issues that impact coming months and years ahead. The body also votes on the budget, deciding the best way to use town funds. Town Meeting will be held on May 15th at 7PM at the High School and lasts about one evening (sometimes two depending on the discussions.) The Town Warrant book, which lists the issues that will be brought before the Town to vote on, will be released a few weeks prior to the meeting to read ahead of time. Next Public Meeting To Attend March 1: Long-Range Strategic Planning Underway

Join your neighbors at our Kick-Off Meeting on March 1st to learn about the Holliston's New Strategic Plan 2024-2030 on March 1 at 7pm via zoom or in person (refreshments at 6:30) at Town Hall. Berry Dunn, the consultant chosen to develop the Town's Strategic Plan, will present the process. The Envisioning Future Holliston Committee (EFH) members will now work with the consultant, representing many groups and disciplines, including sustainability, diversity, economic development and our senior community.

The project, which was approved at Fall Town Meeting, aims to consolidate the Town's many strategic plans (Library, Schools, Police etc.) and the data from the Town-wide survey of 1,200 respondents and over 3,500 open responses to questions focused on many resources and assets of the Town. The goal is to develop a strategic plan and vision for the Town to make the best decisions based on needs. Plans also include leveraging state, federal and grant funding opportunities for Feasibility/Site Review for DPW Facility, Cost Benefit Analysis of Reconstruction/removal of town-owned dams and Horizontal Infrastructure projects like water, roadways, and sidewalks.

Blair Square: Blair Square will be back by Memorial Day, thanks to the weather cooperating for outdoor work! Keep an eye out for our Grand Opening Ceremony. (Plot plan below or at link above.)





LED Conversion of Streetlights: In the past year, the Town has taken ownership of the existing streetlight network from Eversource. We now have the opportunity to convert all of the street lights to energy efficient LED lighting. The Town expects to save 270,000kWh of electricity which equates to the electrical consumption of 37 average sized homes. Fixtures are expected in April and installation will begin.

Wastewater Treatment Plant Modernization: The existing plant on Linden Street services the Woodland St. school campus. Over 20 years old, it is being considered for sewering the downtown village commercial area. The project is well underway and all indications are that sewering downtown is possible. Regardless of connecting downtown, the plant still requires modernization:remote monitoring equipment, plumbing changes, process improvements and energy efficiency, complete by August.





9 Green Street Parking Lot To Serve The Downtown: The bid award is scheduled for end of March, launch about 4/10, open by end of June! Parking spots for shops in the downtown will include several EV spots. Beautification of the area the adjacent to the park includes community amenities like picnic tables, game tables and benches!

Holliston Fire Department Updates

Holliston Fire continues to build its staff of On-Call Firefighters, EMT's and Paramedics. Recruiting civilian dispatchers remains a challenge, as municipalities continue to see retirements across the country in all positions of public service. The Town of Holliston will submit an application for a State 911 grant to join a Regional Emergency Call Center. After considerable vetting and cost analysis, the Town voted to move forward with the grant application, to move civilian dispatchers to a RECC in the Town of Holbrook. 

The Town is pleased to offer a low-cost 100% renewable energy service option that reduces the cost of doing business in Holliston! Along with many residents, businesses have been realizing significant savings by participating in the Town's Community Choice Electric Aggregation Program.

Just like residents, Holliston businesses can choose the company they want to use as their electricity supplier. Partnering with NextEra Energy, the Town's last meter reading showed a record of 520 commercial and industrial meters signed up for this 100% rate. When compared to the basic service rate, these businesses saved \$760,437 during the first three quarters of 2022 in our program.
