# **Holliston Welcomes Assistant Fire Chief**

We are pleased to welcome our new Assistant Fire Chief/EMS Director to the Town of Holliston. Assistant Chief Brian Kelley was sworn in this week and is excited to meet the Fire Department team!

#### **Cooking With Caution**

The leading cause of fires in the kitchen is unattended cooking. This year's Fire Prevention Week theme is "Cooking safety starts with YOU. Pay attention to Fire Prevention." Simple but important actions can be taken to keep yourself and those around you safe.

- **Be on alert!** If you are sleepy or have consumed alcohol don't use the stove or stovetop.
- Stay in the kitchen while you are frying, boiling, grilling or broiling food. If you leave the room, turn off the stove.
- If you are simmering, baking, or roasting food, check it regularly and remain at home; use a timer as a reminder.
- Keep anything that can catch fire-oven mitts, wooden spoons, towels or curtains-away from the stovetop.
- If you have a small (grease) cooking fire and decide to fight it, on the stovetop smother the flames by sliding a lid over the pan and turn off burner. Oven fires, turn off heat and keep door closed.
- If you have any doubt about fighting a small fire...
  JUST GET OUT! When you leave, close the door behind you and dial 911 from outside.
