#### The Formula To Auto Excise Taxes

All residents who own and register a motor vehicle or trailer pay an annual motor vehicle excise tax for the privilege of actual or future road use. Cities and Towns prepare the bills based on data sent to us by the Mass Registry of Motor Vehicles (RMV). It's the RMV that sets the value of your vehicle, not the Town, based on the manufacturers' list price and the age of the vehicle. The excise tax rate is \$25 per thousand dollars of valuation. The formula is: 50% of value for a brand new car rebased before the model year; 90% in the model year; 60% in the second year; 40% in the third year; 25% in the fourth year; and, 10% in the fifth and succeeding years.

If you receive a motor vehicle excise tax bill for a vehicle that you no longer own, or that is no longer located in Holliston or the state, you should first check with the RMV to see if the registration is still active. Go to <a href="https://atlas-myrmv.massdot.state.ma.us/myrmv">https://atlas-myrmv.massdot.state.ma.us/myrmv</a> and click on "Cancel My Registration". If you have moved out of Holliston, sold or traded your vehicle, "totaled" your car in an accident, or if your car is stolen, you may be entitled to an abatement of auto excise taxes you already paid. Please look carefully for the required documentation related to your reason for applying for the abatement. The assessor's office cannot process the application until all required documents are submitted.



#### **Projects Planned That Make An Impact**

The Municipal Parking Lot (with EV) at 9 Green Street is one of the key revitalization projects underway



to bring much needed parking to the downtown area, giving more accessibility to businesses, the library and Goodwill Park. The Town was awarded \$194,200 last week from MassDOT to complete this

project, on top of the funds approved by Town Meeting. Work will continue through the fall, and will include landscaping areas in Goodwill Park, bike racks and other amenities. *Click here for project updates*.

The Blair Square Redesign project received approval from the CPC, and various grants (including the Office of Travel and Tourism) are pending. Holliston's Farmer's Markets (held every Sunday, June 5 - Oct 2 from 9:30am - 1pm) will continue at Blair Square this year and will include artists and music. This beautiful spot has proven


